


## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN PVTC

### You are the Chairperson of the Chief Minister's Special Taskforce for Skill Development. Can you tell us about the objectives of the task force and the impact you aim to make on vocational education in Punjab?

Under the leadership of Honorable Chief Minister Punjab, Ms. Maryam Nawaz, the Chief Minister's Special Taskforce for Skill Development envisions revolutionizing vocational education in Punjab. The task force is dedicated to bridging skill gaps, promoting industry-relevant training, and creating opportunities for our youth. We aim to introduce demand-driven trades in fields like Artificial Intelligence, Cybersecurity, Healthcare, and modern Construction technologies. The focus is on enhancing accessibility to training centres, particularly in rural areas, and ensuring a strong linkage between training programs and employment opportunities.

The CM's Task Force for Skill Development is working on a revolutionary plan. Can you explain the reasoning behind this plan and its expected impact on the overall

#### TVET sector?

The revolutionary plan spearheaded by Honorable Madam Chief Minister Punjab focuses on shifting from outdated trades to globally relevant skills. This vision aligns with the need to prepare our youth for emerging industries and international markets. By investing in upskilling instructors, upgrading labs, and implementing cuttingedge curricula, the plan aims to create a competitive workforce capable of meeting global standards. This will not only enhance local and international employability but also contribute to Pakistan's economic growth through increased foreign remittances and industrial productivity.

### You mentioned the need for restructuring PVTC and other skill-imparting organizations on modern lines. Can you provide more details on the changes being implemented and the expected outcomes?

Honorable Chief Minister Punjab has been instrumental in guiding the restructuring process of PVTC and other skill-development organizations. The changes include modernizing 370 practical labs, introducing advanced IT-based courses, and phasing out trades with limited market demand. This restructuring will not only improve





employability but also attract international collaborations and enhance PVTC's reputation as a centre of excellence in vocational education.

# PVTC faces several financial constraints that impact its ability to expand and enhance vocational training programs. What strategies or policies does Honorable Chief Minister Punjab and you envision to address these financial challenges and ensure PVTC can effectively fulfill its mission?

The government has prioritized the financial stability of skill development organizations, including PVTC. Substantial grants have been allocated to upgrade infrastructure and launch innovative training programs. Honorable Chief Minister Punjab, Ms. Maryam Nawaz has announced that Government of The Punjab will bear the training cost of 60,000 PVTC trainees this year. We are also pursuing public-private partnerships, donor collaborations, and income-generating initiatives to create a self-sustaining model for PVTC. These efforts will enable PVTC to expand its reach and enhance its training quality without compromising financial sustainability.

### How do you see the role of vocational training evolving in Punjab, and what interventions have been recommended by Honorable Chief Minister Punjab to bridge skill gaps and prepare youth for the job market?

Vocational training is no longer limited to traditional trades; it has become a critical pillar of Punjab's socio-economic development strategy. Under the vision of Honorable Chief Minister Punjab, PVTC is introducing specialized courses in emerging fields like digital marketing, medical technology, and renewable energy. These interventions aim to equip our youth with the skills needed to meet industry demands and contribute meaningfully to the economy.

# Can you share any recent initiatives that aim to make TVET more inclusive for women and marginalized communities?

To enhance accessibility and participation of women and girls I TVET sector Honorable Chief Minister Punjab has launched a great initiative under the name of IT Support For Rural women aimed at fostering entrepreneurial aptitude in the women of rural areas and utilize their potential for empowering the women and the progress of the country. For a more inclusive workforce and TVET scenario, Honorable Chief Minister Punjab has also launched a skill training programs for transgender community as well, in trades like Dress Making, Fashion Designing, Beauty Services, Video Editing, Graphic Designing and Domestic Worker for their hand holding and helping them become respectable citizens of the society.

# The government has always placed a strong emphasis on socio-economic development. How do you envision PVTC's role in driving economic uplift through vocational training?

PVTC plays a pivotal role in driving economic growth through demand-driven vocational training. By equipping youth with market-relevant skills and facilitating industrial placements, PVTC contributes to creating a skilled workforce that enhances productivity and fosters economic independence. The focus on globally recognized certifications further ensures that PVTC graduates are competitive in the international job market.

### How can PVTC contribute to the goals of the Chief Minister's Taskforce for TVET, and are there any specific areas where you'd like to see enhanced partnership?

PVTC is central to achieving the goals of the Chief Minister's Taskforce for Skill Development. Enhanced partnerships with international donors, local industries, and educational institutions will provide the resources needed to scale our initiatives. Areas such as curriculum development, instructor training, and industry-specific certifications require strategic collaboration to maximize the impact of our efforts.

# What message would you like to convey to young individuals who are considering vocational training as a pathway to their careers?

My message to the youth who want to take up vocational training and make a career in this field is two folded, first of our university graduates have opportunities to excel in ICT related trades especially in Cyber Security, Cloud Computing, AI based Data Analytics and E commerce even without prior ICT background and embark on a new career having unlimited opportunities of growth. Second group is of young drop outs and left outs, vocational training is the most effective and efficient way out for them to secure respectable livelihood. Unfortunately there are some dilemmas and stigma attached with vocational training and our youth is instilled towards migrating abroad and without acquiring sills such migrations end up in doing odd jobs. Sill training will definitely enable them to secure better opportunities and earn more with dignity and respect.

## Lastly, if we describe Mr. Adnan Afzal Chatha in one word or phrase, what would it be?

Expressing me in one word or phrase is a tough task. My passion to deliver for my people has always been a major driving force in my life so I would like to be remembered as a person who made positive impacts in lives of people and served the nation.








# OUR CITIES - OUR PRIDE DISTRICT ATTOCK

District Attock, located at the crossroads of history and development, holds a unique place in Pakistan's landscape. Its historical importance dates back to 1581, when Emperor Akbar the Great, recognizing its strategic value, built the iconic Attock Fort Complex. Over time, the district witnessed intense power struggles, from the rise of the Sikhs in Punjab and the Durrani Afghans in the west to the eventual British conquest in the 19th century. Under British rule, the region saw significant modernization, including the establishment of a rail line and the construction of the first permanent bridge over the Indus River in 1880. In 1904, Attock district was formally constituted by integrating Talagang Tehsil from Jhelum and the tehsils of Pindigheb, Fateh Jang, and Attock from Rawalpindi. Originally named Campbellpur in honor of Sir Campbell, who laid the foundation of Campbellpur City in 1908, the district reclaimed its historical name, Attock, in 1978. Spanning 6,857 square kilometers, Attock is bordered by Rawalpindi, Chakwal, and Mianwali districts, while the mighty Indus River forms its western boundary, separating it from the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa districts of Swabi, Haripur, Kohat, and Nowshera. The



district comprises six tehsils—Attock, Jand, Fateh Jang, Pindi Gheb, Hazro, and Hassanabdal—and features 349 villages, seven towns, and three cantonments. Attock's climate is characterized by warm, wet summers and cold winters, with temperatures ranging from 50°C in peak summer to -2°C in winter. The district receives an average annual rainfall of 783 mm. Its fertile lands support the cultivation of wheat, maize, peanuts, pulses, and fodder, making agriculture a cornerstone of its economy.

Attock is also home to a robust industrial sector. The district hosts several key industries, including cement manufacturing, textiles, engineering goods, and glass production. The Kamra Aeronautical Complex and Sanjwal Ordinance Factories are significant contributors to both local employment and Pakistan's defence industry. These facilities not only provide jobs but also produce essential defence equipment, services, and ammunition for the Pakistan Army and Air Force.

According to the 2023 Census, District Attock has a population of 2,170,423, with a population density of 316.5 individuals per square kilometer. The district has experienced an annual population growth rate of 2.4% between 2017 and 2023. Of the total population,



1,089,655 are males, 1,080,687 are females, and 81 individuals identify as transgender. A majority of the population, 1,546,439, resides in rural areas, while 623,984 live in urban centers. With a literacy rate of 70%, Attock showcases significant progress in education, reflecting its commitment to human resource development and a skilled workforce.

The Punjab Vocational Training Council (PVTC) has been instrumental in harnessing Attock's potential by providing skill-based education to its youth. PVTC's Vocational Training Institutes (VTIs) in the district aim to bridge the gap between the local workforce and industrial demands, ensuring sustainable development and economic growth. Established in 2005, VTI Hassanabdal offers courses suited best to the needs of the city. With 4,763 passouts and a placement ratio of 54%, the institute has made significant contributions to empowering the local community. The VTI's commitment to equipping students with skills that address local needs while unlocking their potential for personal and community growth is commendable. Since its inception in 2003, VTI Fateh Jang has become a hub for skill development in trades such as Computer Operations, Dress Making,

## A HABIT THAT WILL CHANGE YOUR LIFE


