BAITHAK & BEYOND MS. SHAMEELAH ISMAIL - COUNCIL MEMBER

Can you share a bit about your early life and family background?

I grew up in a family that valued hard work, empathy, and social responsibility. My parents taught me to look beyond myself and care deeply for those around me. They instilled in me the importance of giving back and standing up for those less privileged. This foundation shaped my desire to create impact and make a difference in society.

What were your childhood dreams and aspirations? Did you always envision becoming a social entrepreneur?

As a little girl, I was full of dreams — most of them revolved around creating something meaningful. I didn't know the term "social entrepreneur" back then, but I always felt drawn to helping people, especially women who were struggling. I used to imagine a world where every woman could stand tall, proud, and financially independent. Over time, that dream took shape as social entrepreneurship, allowing me to combine business with purpose.

How did your educational journey shape your professional career?

Education opened doors for me — not just in terms of knowledge, but in how I saw the world. It gave me the confidence to ask "why not?" and the courage to challenge traditions. My learning journey taught me that success is not about personal gain; it's about using your education to uplift communities and drive systemic change.

What inspired you to establish GharPar?

GharPar was born from witnessing the silent struggles of women around me — women full of talent, but with no platform or voice. I met mothers who couldn't afford school fees, young girls forced to abandon dreams due to financial barriers. I knew I couldn't sit still. I wanted to bridge this gap by providing a technology-driven platform where they could offer beauty and wellness services at clients' doorsteps, enabling them to earn with dignity and flexibility.

What were some of the biggest challenges you faced in launching and expanding GharPar?

Every step was a challenge — convincing women to trust a new platform, dealing with societal judgments, breaking age-old stereotypes. Additionally, creating digital literacy among women from underserved communities was a hurdle we had to thoughtfully address. There were days I doubted myself. But each time a woman stood taller because of us, each time a child's future became brighter,

I knew every challenge was worth it.

GharPar has significantly uplifted thousands of women. Can you share a success story that stands out to you?

There's one story that I carry in my heart. A single mother joined us as a shy practitioner, unable to make ends meet. Today through GharPar, not only has she built her own home, but she sends both her daughters to college something she once thought impossible. She now trains and mentors new practitioners and speaks with a confidence that moves me to tears. That's the magic of empowerment.

You have received numerous prestigious awards and global recognition. Which achievement holds the most personal significance for you and why?

While awards and honors feel wonderful, what moves me most is seeing GharPar taught as a case study at institutions like Harvard and Yale Universities. Knowing that students around the world are learning from the stories of Pakistani women — that, to me, is pure magic. It tells me our journey matters far beyond borders.

As a member of the PVTC Council, how do you see the role of PVTC in the TVET sector of Pakistan?

PVTC is a lifeline for thousands who dream of standing on their own feet. I see it as a beacon of hope — a place where skills are not just taught, but futures are built. PVTC's emphasis on vocational training creates pathways for financial independence, particularly for women and youth, enabling them to become contributors to the economy. The work PVTC does, especially for women, is creating ripples of change that will be felt for generations.

How do you think vocational training, particularly for women, can be enhanced to create greater socioeconomic impact?

Vocational training needs to evolve beyond just teaching skills. It must empower women with confidence, financial literacy, and leadership training. These women should feel capable of not just earning, but leading, growing, and transforming their communities.

What are your key priorities for PVTC's future under your leadership as a council member?

I want to see PVTC become a launchpad for dreams. My focus is on expanding training in underserved regions, integrating digital education, and creating direct pathways from classrooms to real-world opportunities. Every woman who trains with PVTC should walk away feeling unstoppable while entering fields traditionally



considered unconventional.

In your opinion, how can PVTC and GharPar collaborate to provide more opportunities for skilled women?

Together, we can bridge the critical gap between learning and earning. By creating onboarding channels where PVTC graduates can immediately join GharPar's platform, we can help skilled women step straight into independence and opportunity — with mentorship every step of the way. Lastly, co-developing training modules that focus on beauty and wellness services can further increase employability and entrepreneurial capacity.

What advice would you give to young women aspiring to build their own businesses or enter the workforce?

Don't wait for the "perfect" moment — it will never come. Start small, learn fast, fall often, and rise stronger. Don't be afraid of failure — it is often the most powerful teacher. Your dreams are valid, and your voice matters. Surround yourself with those who believe in you, and most importantly, believe in yourself relentlessly.

With your extensive international exposure, how do you perceive the current status of Pakistani women in terms of financial independence, career choices, and freedom in decision-making? What key steps should be taken to bridge the gap with global standards?

Pakistani women are making great strides, but systemic

barriers still exist. We need more inclusive policies, greater financial access, and gender-sensitive work environments. We also need to normalize conversations around women in leadership and ownership roles, both socially and institutionally. We must celebrate every woman who dares to break the mold and make room for thousands more.

What is your long-term vision for GharPar and its impact on women's empowerment?

My vision is simple yet bold: I want to see GharPar as a global symbol of how technology can transform lives. I dream of scaling this model globally, giving millions of women the tools to rise above poverty and build legacies of empowerment for their children.

If we try to express Ms. Shameelah Ismail in one word or phrase, what would it be?

A catalyst for transformative change. Finally, what is your message to the female trainees of PVTC who are working towards a better future through vocational training?

I want to tell every one of you, you are powerful beyond measure. Your skills are your wings. Use them to fly as high as your dreams will take you. Don't let fear stop you. The world is waiting for your brilliance. Go claim your place in it.

This initiative aims to enhance employability, equip our youth with globally relevant skills, and bolster Pakistan's workforce participation on the international stage.



OUR CITIES - OUR PRIDE DISTRICT CHINIOT

Chiniot's rich history dates back to Alexander the Great's conquest of the Punjab region in 331 BCE. Over the centuries, it has been ruled by the Maurya Empire, Indo-Greek Kingdom, Kushan Empire, Gupta Empire, White Huns, Shahi Kingdoms, Delhi Sultanate, Mughal Empire, Sikh Empire, and later, the British. The region became predominantly Muslim due to the influence of Sufi saints, whose shrines continue to be revered.

Chiniot, the 36th district of Punjab, was officially recognized on July 1, 2009, by former Chief Minister Mr. Shahbaz Sharif. The district, having history and cultural significance, has played an essential role in shaping Punjab's economic and industrial landscape. Covering an area of 2,643 square kilometers, Chiniot comprises three tehsils, 39 union councils, and 361 villages, with a robust road network of 1,312 km.

The district thrives on a diverse economic base, with major occupations spanning civil and armed services, overseas employment, and farming. Chiniot is home to 609 industrial units, including three sugar mills, five textile mills, 85 brick kilns, and 513 furniture manufacturing



units. The district is renowned for its master-crafted wooden furniture, which is highly sought after in both national and international markets.

Agriculture remains a dominant sector, with 533,034 acres of cultivated land, out of which 528,634 acres are irrigated. The region also supports a livestock population of 0.612 million, contributing significantly to the local economy. The fertile lands of Chiniot make it a key agricultural hub in Punjab.

With an estimated population of 1.369 million (Male 51%, Female 49%), Chiniot boasts a literacy rate of 70%, reflecting its commitment to education. The district has 697 schools and 11 colleges, including five for boys, five for girls, and one commerce college. Educational initiatives continue to expand, ensuring better opportunities for the youth.

Chiniot is known for its stunning architecture and contributions to Pakistan's social, political, and economic landscape. One of its most remarkable landmarks is the Shahi Mosque, built in 1655 during the Mughal era, showcasing intricate craftsmanship and mesmerizing



calligraphy. Another architectural marvel is the Omar Hayat Mahal, a five-story wooden mansion adorned with exquisite carvings, reflecting the artistic excellence of Chiniot's renowned woodworkers. The city is also home to the Chenab River, which not only enhances its scenic beauty but has also played a vital role in agriculture and trade for centuries.

Chiniot has produced several influential personalities who have made significant contributions to Pakistan. Chaudhry Muhammad Barjees Tahir, a prominent politician, has served as a federal minister in various capacities. Fazal llahi Chaudhry, Pakistan's fifth President (1973-1978), hailed from Chiniot and played a key role in shaping the country's political landscape. The city is also known for its world-class furniture industry, with artisans whose craftsmanship is recognized internationally. Moreover, Mian Muhammad Mansha, one of Pakistan's most successful business tycoons, traces his roots to Chiniot and has been instrumental in shaping the country's banking and textile sectors. The contributions of these individuals, along with Chiniot's rich history and cultural heritage, make it a district of great importance in Pakistan.

PVTC's Vocational Training Institutes (VTIs) play a pivotal role in equipping Chiniot's youth with employable skills. Since its inception in April 2005, VTI Chiniot has made significant contributions, including being the district topper in Punjab for Village Officers (Patwari) recruitment and achieving a 70% placement rate for Clinical Assistant trainees in Rescue 1122. VTI graduates are actively



contributing to provincial and federal departments and the textile industry in Chiniot and Faisalabad. Trades offered by VTIs in Chiniot include Computer Operator, General Electrician, Clinical Assistant, HVACR, Industrial Stitching & Machine Operator, Dress Making, and Beautician. The satellite campus in Bhowana, established in July 2016, further extends skill development opportunities to the region.

With Chiniot's workforce comprising 57% of the population aged between 15 and 49, vocational training is essential for economic empowerment. The district's industrial expansion, particularly in textiles and manufacturing, demands a skilled workforce, and PVTC plays a crucial role in bridging this gap. Over 10,000 trainees have benefited



from PVTC's training programs, leading to increased employment and entrepreneurship opportunities. This initiative is particularly vital for women,



as PVTC's partnership with multiple industry leaders, fosters employment, allowing women to contribute to household income while balancing family responsibilities. With a strong industrial base, rich historical heritage, and growing vocational training opportunities, Chiniot stands as a district of immense potential. PVTC continues to play a crucial role in enhancing employability and economic stability, ensuring that Chiniot's skilled workforce contributes effectively to Pakistan's development.
