PUNJAB VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL'S CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

After assuming charge of acting Chairman PVTC and getting detailed briefing from the team, I am of the view that PVTC is doing a great job of poverty alleviation through skill training with a 60% plus employment ratio of its graduates. Year 2023 seems productive as PVTC has been able to achieve a major milestone in implementing Competency Based Training and Assessment (CBT&A) Courses in all its VTIs across Punjab. Currently 28 CBT &A Courses and 17 conventional courses are being offered across all VTIs whereas new CBT&A curricula is being developed in collaboration with NAVTTC with focus on green skills.

Establishment of Center of Excellence at Lahore, Multan and Rawalpindi will hopefully commence this year which will be major breakthrough for PVTC. Registration of VTIs with Punjab Skill Development Authority (PSDA) is under process for the year 2023-24 and collaboration agreement with PSDF and other doner organizations are being signed for skill training.

I urge my team to put in their best to achieve our organizational, provincial and national goals with real zeal and enthusiasm. I am very positive that PVTC's overall performance in terms of quality training and higher employability ratio of graduates will be up to the national and international standards.


WEBINAR IN COLLABORATION WITH MRC ON

She has also been nominated by the Punjab Government as council member of Punjab Vocational and Training Council and Director for Quaid e Azam Thermal Power Limited. She is one of the founder directors at LAMA Retail a fashion brand launched in 2021.

Q. Please tell us about your early life and your childhood dream!

I was Born to one of the visionary industrialist

Q. What was your motivation to become a business woman?

My father supported and encourged his daughters a choice as far as professional education or working was concerned. He believed that women's participation in economy was essential for Pakistan's Development.

Q. Please tell our readers about Schazoo Zaka and your role in it!

I dropped out of university without completing my Degree of Pharmacy to get married which disappointed my father. My father passed away in 1989. Eight years into my marriage in 1991, I lost my husband to an accident. I re-joined the University and completed my degree in Pharmacy. During my education to complete my Degree of Pharmacy in

1991, I started working in the Schazoo Laboratories Pvt Ltd after university hours the parent company established by my father. Following the vision of my father my siblings and I started the new purpose-built pharmaceutical plant Schazoo Zaka PVT Ltd in a rural area 25 kilometres out of Lahore in 2004. Schazoo Zaka was built by the four siblings with the vision of getting International Accreditation and exporting our products worldwide. We started manufacturing in 2008. I was heading the Supplychain of Schazoo Laboratories from 1991 to 2010 and I am the Director Supplychain at Schazoo Zaka since 2005.

Q. How was your experience being the council member of PVTC?

Other then Schazoo Zaka I started my Fashion Brand Designer Collection in 1992. I wanted skilled and trained tailors for my brand which took me through the LCCI to Technical Training Schools of Lahore. I was part of the team who came up with the idea of TEVTA and PVTC for deserving youth. Only Skill Development can turn around the quality of our manufacturing sector. I never looked back and have been contributing my time, knowledge and efforts to Technical Education

Development with a focus on girls. In colaborations with PVTC I was able to start a vocational training centre for

girls at our free school next to Schazoo Zaka in 2020. Girls from six villages are being trained at VTI Kallalwala.

Q. Please tell our readers about the major interventions taken to uplift PVTC and its employees in your tenure?

We could not contribute as much as we wanted during the Covid pandemic lockdown but the management and the boards kept PVTC going through very bad times of lockdown by focusing on improvements in curriculum and training.

Q. Have there been any gender specific projects or interventions introduced during your tenure as female council member of PVTC?

My focus has always been to provide skills and financial independence to girls and PVTC gives a lot of opportunities to girls for skill development.

Q. In your opinion, how can girls and women of our society can benefit from vocational training and how can they play their part in country's economic and

DISTRICT CHAKWAL

OUR CITIES - OUR PRIDE

Chakwal is located 90 kilometers south-west of the federal capital, Islamabad and 270 kilometers from the provincial capital, Lahore. It is located in the Dhanni Region of the Potohar in Northern Punjab, Pakistan. According to the District Gazetteer Jhelum 1904, the city Chakwal is named after Chaudhry Chaku Khan, from Jammu who founded it in 1525 during the era of the Mughal emperor, Zaheerudin Babur. It remained a small but central town of Taluka Dhan Chaurasi for many centuries. In 1881, during the British era, it was declared the Tehsil Headquarter. It was finally upgraded to district status in 1985. The history of the area dates back to the semi-mythical period of the Maha-Bharat. Chakwal is a site of famous encounter of Alexander the great with Raja Ambhi. Chakwal region's district capital is the city of Chakwal. Chakwal District has five tehsils i.e., Kallar Kahar, Choa Saidan Shah, Chakwal, Talagang and Lawa. For many early years, this region was under the reign of Dogra Rajputs and Khokhar Rajputs.



Chakwal city in itself, although heavily influenced by the village lifestyle, has more of an urban environment. Chakwal is also known as Military valley. Chakwal's unique culture and its rich history make it a very interesting region. Chakwal has been bestowed by rich culture, history, art and extravagant environment. Once been known as a picnic spot of the Mughal Dynasty and the British Lords, Chakwal still offers a unique landscape to its visitors. World-renowned Kallar Kahar Lake, Takht-e-Babri, a stage built of stone by Emperor Babar to address his Army, Bagh-e-Safa and above all Katas Raj Temples (famous temples-fort and Medieval University surrounded by 100 temples built over a period of 1000 years by the Hindu rajas) are some ideal places for tourists. The famous temple of 'Katas' holds great significance for Hindus who come here for worship as Kitas's name is mentioned in Hindu holy book 'Maha Bharat' (written in 300 BC).



Chakwal is mainly an agriculture area. Currently Chakwal is famous for production of international standard oranges, wheat, barley, sugarcane, peanuts, olive and many other fruits and vegetables. Many international cement companies have planted their factories around the city. The Chakwal District is divided into five Tehsils, namely, Kalar-Kahar, Choa Saidan Shah, Talagang, Lawa and Chakwal itself. Total Area of the district is 1,864,934 acres out of which cultivated area is 831,772 acres while the irrigated area consists of 10,894 acres. Forest makes up 143,377 acres in the whole district. Chakwal's literacy rate is above 90%. Chakwal is the 66th largest city of Pakistan by population with a total population of 1.495 million out of which 49.96% population is male and remaining 50.04% is female.



The climate of Chakwal is considered to be a local steppe climate. The summer season starts from the month of April and continues till October. May and June are the hottest months. The winter season begins from the month of November and continues till March. January is the coldest month. Dust storms occur occasionally during summer season relieving temporarily the intensity of heat. Monsoon spells start from the end of June.

VTI Jhamra in Tehsil Kallar Kahar was established in 2006 with 04 trades. VTI Jhamra is also offering a trade in SVTI Choa Saiden Shah. It has total of 4,102 pass outs with an

overall employability ratio of 52%.

VTI Talagang was established in --- and currently it is offering 5 trades in its 02 campuses which are VTI Talagang (Main) and SVTI Balkasar. Total pass outs of 5055 with employability ratio of 59%.

EMPOWERING WOMEN



Empowerment of women refers to giving decision making power to women in social, economic and political sphere of life. Empowerment of women is very much essential to achieve sustainable development. It is prerequisite gender equality and sustainable development. Having women involved in decision-making broadens the perspectives, increases creativity and innovation, diversifies the pool of talents and competences, reduces conflicts, and improves the process of decision-making. Women play an important role in taking decision on important family matters. The educated working women are enjoying more rights and privileges than those who are uneducated and unemployed. But, these uneducated and unemployed women are also performing important economic roles in their respective households. Women are less likely to be entrepreneurs and face more disadvantages while starting businesses: In 40% of economies, women's early stage entrepreneurial activity is half or less than half of that of men globally. Women are constrained from achieving the highest leadership positions as only 5% of Fortune 500 CEOs are Women. Violence and harassment in the world of work affects women regardless of age, location, income or social status. Women's economic empowerment is central to realizing women's rights and gender equality. Women's economic empowerment includes women's ability to

participate equally in existing markets; their access to and control over productive resources, access to decent work, control over their own time, lives and bodies; and increased voice, agency and meaningful participation in economic decision-making at all levels from the household to international institutions. Increasing women's and girls' educational attainment contributes to women's economic empowerment and more inclusive economic growth. Education, upskilling and re-skilling over the life course; especially to keep pace with rapid technological and digital transformations affecting jobs are critical for women's and girl's health and wellbeing, as well as their income-generation opportunities and participation in the formal labour market.

I pray day and night for the VTI management especially my teachers and PVTC who enabled me to lead a sustainable life with dignity, comfort and empowerment.

My name is Muhammad Ali and I am a resident of Chakwal. I was very fond of computers since my childhood and wanted to pursue my career in IT field. After completing my formal education, I could not pursue higher education in IT field. During those days, I came to know about VTI Chakwal which was offering free of cost vocational courses. I visited VTI Chakwal and took admission in "Computer Operator" trade in 2022 which proved to be very good for me. I learnt a lot there and acquired skills related to my field with the able guidance of my teachers and fellow trainees. Class atmosphere was conducive to learning and the lab was equipped with state of the art equipment for our daily practical work.
